YOUR EXECUTORS – THE PEOPLE WHO WILL MAKE IT HAPPEN

You can have up to four executors to deal with your wishes. These could be friends, family, or a professional such as your solicitor. Whoever you choose, make sure you ask their permission. *Make a note of your executor(s) below.*

APPOINTING GUARDIANS

If you have children, this is probably one of your major motivations for writing a will in the first place. Discuss your wishes with the people you wish to appoint to make sure they agree. *Again, note down their names in the space below.*

CHOOSE A SOLICITOR

The best way to find a reliable solicitor is word of mouth. A recommendation from a friend is always useful. Alternatively, there are lots of websites that will list solicitors in your area.
