Why Plan works in Indonesia

The Republic of Indonesia is extremely poor; 50% of the population live on less than £1 a day and half of all children do not attend secondary school. Many schools lack the resources they need to be able to teach and encourage children in school.

Plan recognises that education is a crucial way to beat poverty – enabling boys and especially girls to gain the skills and knowledge they need to pull their communities out of poverty and reach their full potential in life.

How you can help

We aim to raise £56,450 to supply 45,000 library books to primary schools in Indonesia, providing reading books and text books on a range of subjects will help teachers to engage their pupils and make learning a little easier.

Why Plan works in Indonesia

The Republic of Indonesia is extremely poor; 50% of the population lives on less than £1 a day. Indonesia is prone to climate and geological related hazards including earthquakes, landslides, tsunamis, cyclones, volcanic eruptions and drought.

Providing communities with the appropriate skills and knowledge they need to confront the risk of disaster before the worst happens, and encouraging them to take action can greatly reduce the impact of these, protecting livelihoods and assets and preventing financial, physical and emotional distress.

How you can help

We aim to raise £161,060 to strengthen communities' resilience to disasters by increasing their awareness of the risks they face and advising them on how they can reduce these. Plan will help to set up and support children's associations and youth clubs which will increase their member's awareness and encourage them to devise campaigns and create drawings highlighting the need for disaster risk reduction in the community.
