Why Plan works in Sudan

Sudan is one of the largest countries in Africa. But despite growing revenues from oil and increased foreign investment, 65% of the population is still living below the poverty line on less than £1 a day. Less than half of all children attend primary school.

Plan recognises that education is a crucial way to beat poverty – enabling boys and especially girls to gain the skills and knowledge they need to pull their communities out of poverty and reach their full potential in life.

How you can help

We aim to raise funds to help build classrooms in all Plan programme areas, to give children access to a safe and clean learning environment so that they can develop the skills and knowledge to build a better future for themselves, their families and their communities.

Plan enables poor communities to take action together to achieve children's rights to an education, decent healthcare, clean drinking water and more. We give long-term practical support so poor communities can improve the lives of their children and themselves. We also campaign to change the way a whole range of adults - from parents to politicians - think and act, because we know their decisions can perpetuate poverty.

Children themselves can be powerful advocates for change, so we encourage them to take part in decision making, from village councils to national assemblies. And because children will be the leaders of tomorrow, we believe that strengthening their voices now will create a fairer, better world - now and in the future.

To train 25 community healthcare workers in south Sudan, increasing the access to healthcare services for mothers and children

Target: **£18,780**



Why Plan works in Sudan

Sudan is one of the largest countries in Africa. But despite growing revenues from oil and increased foreign investment, 65% of the population is still living below the poverty line on less than £1 a day. Conflict and drought has led to a virtual breakdown in many health services including a lack of skilled personnel. One in every eight children dies before reaching the age of five and around one in five children under five are underweight for their age due to poor nutrition.

All children should have access to good healthcare facilities and it is crucial that mothers have access to healthcare, information and services to help them bring up healthy children.

How you can help

We aim to raise £18,780 to train 25 community healthcare workers in early childcare. The projects aims are to reduce illnesses and diseases such as respiratory infections, malaria, dehydration, diarrhoea and worms by raising awareness of symptoms, causes and suitable treatments. This knowledge will help future generations to avoid and prevent serious illness.

Plan will provide community healthcare workers with the knowledge and skills they need to treat children with minor injuries and illnesses, as well as raising awareness on subjects such as household hygiene, nutrition, sanitation and breastfeeding. In this way, community members can play an active part in changing attitudes towards health and hygiene for the better in their homes and communities.

Plan works closely with communities, governments and non-governmental organisations at a local and national level to make sure projects such as this work as effectively as possible. This is just one of many projects within Plan's wider health programme. With your support, this project can make a difference to the lives of many children, families and communities in Sudan.
